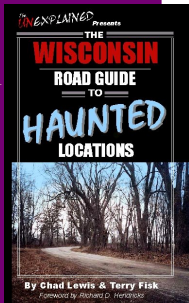

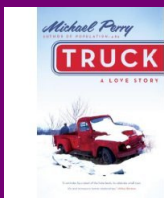
Truck Along with the Book Club
