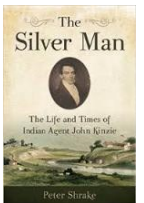

Local History Author Talk

**“The Silver Man: The Life and Times of Indian Agent John Kinzie”
Tuesday, November 1 at 7:00 p.m.**

Author Peter Shrake will discuss his book, “*The Silver Man: The Life and Times of Indian Agent John Kinzie*” at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 1, here at the library. According to the publisher this book gives readers a look at the dramatic changes that swept the Wisconsin frontier in the early and mid-1800s, through the life of Indian agent John Harris Kinzie. From the War of 1812 and the monopoly of the American Fur Company, to the Black Hawk War and the forced removal of thousands of Ho-Chunk people from their native lands, John Kinzie’s experience gives us a front-row seat to a pivotal time in the history of the American Midwest. As an Indian agent at Fort Winnebago - in what is now Portage, Wisconsin - John Kinzie served the Ho-Chunk people during a time of turbulent change. The author is the archivist at Circus World Museum and former executive director of the Sauk County Historical Society. “The Silver Man” is his first book. The talk is being sponsored by the Dells Country Historical Society and the Friends of the Kilbourn Public Library. Refreshments will be served.

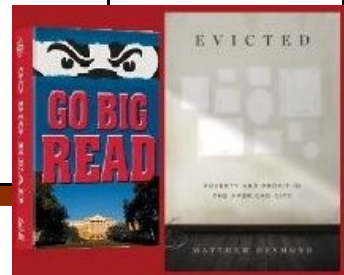
CLOSED FOR INVENTORY

Library Book Club - Go Big Read

"Evicted: Poverty and Profit in the American City," the best-selling book by Matthew Desmond, is the 2016-17 selection for Go Big Read, UW-Madison's common reading program. It is also the November book selection for the Kilbourn Public Library Book Discussion. It is the story of eight Milwaukee families faced with losing their homes. It's also a powerful analysis of a little-known epidemic affecting people across the country living in poverty. Matthew Desmond has spent the last eight years studying evictions from seemingly every possible angle. His research has made him a rising star in the field and last year won him a MacArthur fellowship, the so-called genius grant. Now, with "Evicted: Poverty and Profit in the American City," Mr. Desmond aims to bring an overlooked aspect of American poverty and inequality to a broader audience. We will discuss this book on three different occasions in November. On **Monday, November 28 we will meet at 12:30 p.m. at the Frank Fischer Senior Center in Lake Delton. Also on Monday, November 28 we will meet at 6:30 p.m. at the library. Our Wednesday, November 30 meeting will be at 1:30 p.m. at the library.** This month our Wednesday meeting will be facilitated by UW-Madison Library Science students as part of the Go Big Read Program. Pick up a copy and join us for this opportunity to talk about a little-understood facet of poverty and the profound implications it has for American families.
