## Wo-Zha-Wa Days Book Sale



It's that time again, **Wo-Zha-Wa Days**, when the entire city becomes a fall festival. The Friends of the Kilbourn Public Library will once again hold their biggest book sale of the year during Wo-Zha-Wa weekend. The sale dates are **Friday, September 18 and Saturday, September 19 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.** each day. There will be thousands of items for sale, including books for children and adults, audiobooks, DVDs, videos, CDs and magazines. Thanks to many generous donations we will have a HUGE selection of books that will be sold for 50¢ each or three for \$1.00. There will also be a large collection of current, like-new books and special interest books available at prices ranging from \$1.00 to \$15.00. Collector and rare books are individually priced. Most of the books for the sale

are donated to the Friends of the Kilbourn Library. The sale is one of three held each year. Members of the Friends volunteer their time and are responsible for pricing, setting up, helping with the sales and cleaning up after the sales. All proceeds from the book sales are used to support the library. Book sale proceeds are used to fund library programs and special projects. The Friends are currently raising funds for a New Reading Patio here at the library. Remember, if you are cleaning out your closets and have items to donate to the Friends, we'll be happy to take your donations of used books, magazines or movies anytime. Donations are tax deductible. If you are looking for some great buys to fill up your bookshelf or video collection be sure to stop by the book sale.

### National Library Card SignUp Month



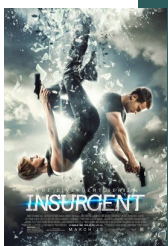
September is National Library Card Sign-up Month. Here at the library we want
