
## Summer Bug Crafts!

### *All We Ever Wanted* by Emily Giffin





## Enjoy the last month of summer with some great reads! Here are some staff picks.

**Cathy recommends:** *Beach Music* by Pat Conroy. In this sweeping novel, an American Southerner living in Rome uncovers his family legacy after his wife commits suicide.

**Laura recommends:** *Dear Edward* by Ann Napolitano. In this book, Edward, a twelve-year-old boy, is the only survivor of a plane crash and deals with the aftermath of this horrible tragedy.

**Charles recommends:** *Vacationland* by Sarah Stonich. The book is a collection of short stories that center around a resort in Northern Minnesota—the characters' stories are linked, but the characters themselves don't stay fixed in time. Engaging characters.

**Kendra recommends:** *Lets Explore Diabetes With Owls* by David Sedaris. David Sedaris writes hilarious and oftentimes poignant essays, and this book is laugh-out-loud funny.

**Eleanor recommends:** *Children of Blood and Bone* by Tomi Adeyemi. This is a Young Adult Fantasy novel set in an alternate Africa. Listening to the audiobook is great, because it immerses you in the story with accents and spoken Yoruba.

**Jody recommends:** Kids' books by Gayle Rosengren, a local Wisconsin author. *What the Moon Said* teaches the main character how to relate to her superstitious mother during the Great Depression, and *Cold War on Maplewood Street* is set during the Cuban Missile Crisis, a time period not usually covered in children's literature.
