Thursday & Friday, November 28 & 29 Closed for the Thanksgiving Holiday.

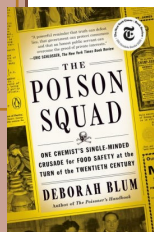

November Book Discussion

The November book selection is *The Poison Squad* by Deborah Blum. The book tells the dramatic true story of the fight for food safety in the United States at the turn of the twentieth century, led by the inimitable Dr. Harvey Washington Wiley. By the end of the 19th century, food was dangerous. This was not by accident. Food manufacturers were knowingly selling harmful products. Unchecked by government regulation, basic safety, or even labelling requirements, they put profit before the health of their customers. Detailing the complex interchanges of industry, media and government regulation with bracing clarity, this eye-opening book offers a prescient perspective on the enormous social and political challenges we face today. We will meet to discuss this book on **Monday, November 25 at 6:30 pm** and **Wednesday, November 27 at 1:30 pm**.
